Inserting /Exchanging the SD Card

### All camera models can use the integrated microSD card (SDXC) to record video data. In order to exchange the microSD card, please proceed as outlined in the following instruction. 





Vandalism set: When using the vandalism set, attach the stainless steel ring with the security screws (torque 0,4 Nm) and use the supplied screwdriver bit to firmly tighten the screws.

## **Initial Operation**



# Boot Options of the v26


By default, the camera starts as DHCP client and automatically tries to get an IP address from a DHCP server. To start the camera in a mode different from the default mode, you can activate the boot menu of the camera.

# 1. Preparing the Camera

- Remove the outer shell and the dome.
- Disconnect the camera's power supply.
- · Reconnect the power supply of the camera.

## 2. Activating the Boot Menu

The red LED lights up 5 to 10 seconds after establishing the power supply and will stay on for 10 seconds. Briefly press th key indicated by the red circle in the figure. The camera enters the boot menu, ready for selecting one of the




